## SERVICE LINE PROTECTION

The City of Salix has partnered with Service Line Warranties of America (SLWA) to offer residential property owners the opportunity, but not the obligation, to purchase a service line warranty for water and sewer line repairs. The water and sewer lines that run from the city's point of contact (main) to the home (including the shut off), are the responsibility of the homeowner. A leak or damage to those lines can be very costly to repair. Residential customers are encouraged to check with your current homeowner's policy to see if you are already covered and if so, what that coverage includes (beware that some service line protection only covers to the curb stop and not all the way to the main). If you are not covered (or partially covered), please take some time to read the future mailings from Service Line Warranties of America to see if it is right for you. We hope that you never need it, but if you do, you'll be glad you were covered.

It's time to clean out those attics, basements and garages!! The City of Salix will be holding one clean up weekend this year but will extend drop off times to 4 days vs. 2 days. Disposal cost for most items is free for city residents (if you currently pay a monthly garbage bill to the city). ## Burning Regulations

As the warmer weather approaches, the City of Salix would like to remind residents that only recreational fires, such as bonfires, and the burning of landscape waste that originated on the premises are allowed. Trees and tree limbs should be taken to the city's onsite burn pile. Garbage, tires, trade wastes, and any locally recyclable goods or plastics may not be burned. Some material and green grass/leaves will cause excess smoke which is particularly harmful to those with breathing issues. Please be respectful of neighbors and do not allow fires to smolder. Choose recycling over open burning wherever possible to avoid harmful emissions and improve air quality.
